And then only two days later I recieved amother one from you. Am glad you liked the flowers. I only wish I could have been there to walk with you in the Easter Parade.

I havent yet been able to locate Roy. I learned from an officer here in the code room that he saw him in L. A. esse he was then encute to San Diego to report for active duty. I checked with the commandants offfice and they had no record of him. You might check with Bonnie and then send me his address.

I am flying to Mesa Arizona next sunday afternoon to spend my
48 hour liberty. You see Eddie KImball can arrange any flight for
me like this any where I care to go. When I get assigned to a ship
I will be given a four day leave after each cruise and I may be

able to fly in to Salt Lake for a day or two.

I finally get my picture taken. I can't decide yet whether it is even a reasonnable facsimile. However I trust it will do.

I am sending it temperow so it should get to you by fri or sat.

And say Afton what would be the chances of getting a larger one of you. I still have the one of you in a small I eather folder and have been taking it with me whereever I go. While on board ship I open up a port hole quite by mistake and before I knew it I had a good part of the Pacific in my room. Among the articles soaked was your picture. However I carefully dried it out and unless one inspects it closely the picture is none the worse for its experience.

I too hope I am in San Diego long about July 23rd. Best it assured I shall do all I can to see that I am. Probably I shall be permanenly asssingned to some ship by then and my one hope now is that at least some of the time I shall be in pert. If not we may have to get married to before I could get leave. At least these those are the circumstances that an emergemcy leave governed by. But be that as it may, I do know that I must see you. Only then can we both determine just what action should be taken and what developments have taken place—since I last saw you—in the case of Paul Felt versus Afton Harris.
